Usage notes: May be used to casually address a friend: Hello wantok.

wantok

- 1. a close friend, to whom one gives complete loyalty
- 2. any person with a shared set of Melanesian cultural values, usually based on speaking a closely related language.

Mal explained to us that in the Solomon Island Christmas is celebrated with the knowledge that although Jesus was born with nothing to poor parents, however he was rich as he had wontok. He was loved by his family and he had mercy, compassion and he cared for others. Wantok is belonging and being loved and valued within the family and extended friends.



Mal suggested we use Christmas to celebrate our wantok.

Ruth is celebrations have also started with her family, and if I remember will be in Wagga Wagga. Ruth also has two family birthdays on Christmas day.


