Membership Sustainability Grants

Youth and Australian Service

In regard to the Youth Protection Policy, Debbie agreed at the last meeting to:

- forward to members the District Youth Protection Policy and Procedure which we are to adopt at the next meeting
- ask members to provide their Working With Children verification details
- register the club as an "employer" and confirm the WWC details of the members.



In regards to the Australian Project we need to establish, Marilyn spoke regarding introducing Books in Homes for a Pre-school in Wagga Wagga identified as an Aboriginal Pre-School.

This program is facilitated by Books in Homes and basically provides a book club for the children, we pay for the books. The children would select their books and they would then be presented to them in a book bag and the preschool would create a reading programme suitable for the students.

We would need to raise \$3500 and could apply to District for a Grant for assistance. The club would need to raise \$1750 to qualify for District Grant.
