### **Membership Sustainability Grant**

We were successful in obtaining a Membership Sustainability Grant from the District. Marilyn Roberts was able to design and have made:

### **District Grant Application**

After hearing about a need in schools in Kiribati for school desks and chairs from new member Tebao Awerika, we submitted a rushed application for a grant to assist us in financing a container of school desks and chair for schools in Kiribati.

Unfortunately, we were unsuccessful with our application, but we are working on getting two containers of school desks and chairs sent to Kiribati soon.

#### **Rotary Foundation**

We had a very pleasing total of \$2052.00 in donations to the Rotary Foundation from our members.

This included one donation by a member of the Rotary Club of Port Macquarie who did a make-up browsing our website and donated \$20.00. The Club decided to donate all make-donations to the Rotary Foundation.

That means our total donations are greater than \$200 per member.

### International Service

### KIVA

The Club establish a membership with Kiva that administers micro-finance loans to individuals and groups in developing countries around the world.

Our members have donated \$335.00 to our Kiva A/C.

This has enable us to make 11 Loans to projects in 9 different countries for projects in Agriculture, Education, Health & Manufacturing.

The majority of recipients were women and the projects were located in Albania, Cambodia, Jordan, Lebanon, Mexico, Pakistan, Uganda, Vietnam, and Zambia.

We have outstanding loans of \$167.83 and available credit of \$25.74

# Six Rotary Australia World Community Service (RAWCS) Projects

#### Indigenous Education Foundation of Tanzania - Orkeeswa Secondary School

RAWCS Project 5-2011-12

To provide high quality secondary education to impoverished children by funding computer laboratory equipment, science building, equipment, purchase of a new bus and a sports pitch, Orkeeswa Secondary School, Tanzania.

Currently in conjunction with the Rotary Club of Geraldton, D9455 we have just conducted a raffle to raise funds for the new bus.

Project Manager is Sharon Daishe.

Current balance in our RAWCS account - \$454.25

#### **Lighthart Project Cambodia**

RAWCS Project 140 - 2010-11

To fund sustainable food systems, maintenance of buildings, improvement of living standards, teacher training, ESL & education of severely disadvantaged children at the Lighthart Project, in Kandal Province and Phnom Penh, Cambodia.

A project in conjunction with the Law Society of NSW who supply most of the funding. They also send at least one team of volunteers per year to verify their expenditure. We transferred \$24,044.54 in payments to the project this year.

Project Manager is John Roberson.

Current balance in our RAWCS account is \$48,288.00





### Community Development & Education Assistance, Santa Isabel, Solomon Islands

RAWCS Project 9 - 2010-11

To provide and build community training and vocational training centres in the Province of Santa Isabel. Assist in training to provide vocational education, leadership, PDHPE, drug/alcohol & youth development programs.

A vocational training centre was completed by volunteers in June 2017 and this year Project Manager, Rev. Malcolm Dunnett was the only volunteer. It is anticipated that a team of about 12 will travel in October 2018 to carry out community leadership training.

#### Little Paths Australia - Tanzania (formerly Kuleana Kids), Mwanza, Tanzania

RAWCS Project 68 – 2009-10

Little Paths Australia is committed to ensuring that Tanzanian families who are experiencing the impacts of extreme poverty, are supported with the tools they need to care for their children and encourage their educational success, from the safety of their family home.

Deputy Project Manager Kate Bowyer travelled twice this year to Mwanza to ensure that the funding was being utilised well on the ground. She had 3 volunteers work with her in September 2017.

Current balance in our RAWCS account is \$8354.14

#### Food Water Shelter Inc. - Kesho Leo Childrens Village at Sinon, Arusha, Tanzania

RAWCS Project 40 – 2006-07

Requires funding to develop the lives of vulnerable women, their children, orphans at Kesho Leo Childrens Village, Sinon, Arusha, Tanzania and the surrounding community.

Project Manager Debbie Schache authorises all transfers of funds for this acclaimed selfsustainable project.

This year she authorised \$32,553.44 in foreign transfers.

Current balance in our RAWCS account is \$1,603.95





## The Lotus Program, ESL & Computer Literacy for Village Schools in Sri Lanka

RAWCS Project 18 - 2005-06

Program includes curriculum development, teacher training and supply of literacy resources, computers and software to remote village schools in Sri Lanka.

This year Project Manager Donna Vaughan authorised fund transfers of \$320.31

Current balance in our RAWCS account is \$6225.46
